- Trends and Future Forecasts for Libraries
 - Challenges
 - Intellectual Freedom Coordinated attacks targeting 1,915 titles in 2023 focusing on a very specific and organized list of ideologies, Legislative Challenges with political climate in Missouri, Cultural Shifts questioning what is acceptable regarding content awareness. Banning books limits access to information and knowledge and that undermines the work of libraries both public and academic.
 - Disinformation Lack of fact checking. AI generated content uses

probability models to forecast the next word generating what appears to be creative content. The more we use AI the more it is beginning to fail us as it is anticipating the same content. Social Media provides a multitude of disinformation.
