

E-Journal (to browse journal issues)

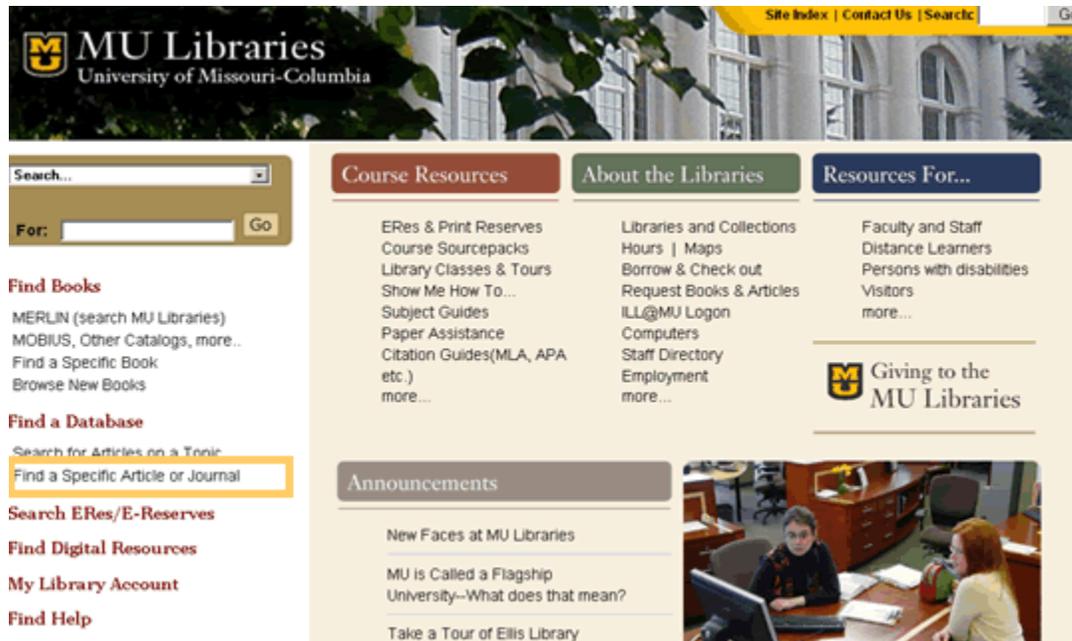
To link to an e-journal you must use the following linking algorithm:

<http://proxy.mul.missouri.edu:2048/login?url=http://mulibraries.1cate.com/?issn=XXXXXXXX>

Replace the XXXXXXXX in the above algorithm with the ISSN number for your specific journal.

To find the ISSN for your e-journal follow these steps:

1. Go to the [MU Libraries Gateway](http://mulibraries.missouri.edu/). (<http://mulibraries.missouri.edu/>)
2. From the left menu, select “Find a Specific Article or Journal” link to e-journals.

4. Add the ISSN (00264326—no hyphens) to the linking algorithm listed above.

5. Return to your Blackboard course and paste the link in assignment title or assignment instructions. Set Options as desired and select Submit. The assignment now links out to the journal.
