### **I. Academic Search Premier and other EBSCOhost databases**


1. Find the desired article in the EBSCOhost database.

3. Click the article title to get to the complete record. There will be a **Persistent Link** to this record towards the bottom of the screen. Copy this entire link.





Abstract:	The article explores the nutritional needs of <b>cancer</b> survivors in Australia. Evidence that dietary intakes of vegetables, fruit or related nutrients affect recurrence or survival is supportive but not conclusive. Dietary supplement use is very common among <b>cancer</b> survivors, but there are few research on the effect of nutritional supplements on <b>cancer</b> recurrence and survival. Lifestyle interventions have shown promise for <b>cancer</b> survivors, particularly in women with breast <b>cancer</b> .

## II. JSTOR

### Linking to Articles

1. You will need to use the JSTOR Citation Linking Tool (<http://makealink.jstor.org/public-tools/GetURL>) to create durable links for JSTOR articles. Fill out the form with the relevant information for the desired article.

2. Note: Title refers to Journal title, NOT the article title. You must select a journal title from the pull-down menu.
3. Then enter the identifying information for the article by using one of these options on the form:
  - Volume and Issue Numbers AND Starting Page Number
  - Publication Date AND Starting Page Number
4. Click "Retrieve the Citation and URL" button.

5. Copy the permanent URL for the article. Return to your Blackboard course and paste the link in assignment title (link) or assignment instructions.(link). **Do not click submit yet.** Read instructions below for off-campus access.
6. Copy and then paste the proxy prefix to the beginning of the JSTOR permanent article URL so that students who are accessing from off-campus will also be able to view the article,. The proxy prefix is:

For example, the entire URL for a link to an article in *Geographical Review* found in JSTOR will be:
