

St. Paul wrote: 'If I have all faith so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing.' This group photobook, modest in size and black-and-white, speaks to our love of God and Humanity. Our environments and spirit are also key; they too relate to the love and life in and around us. Realizing the AWPA Press isn't a large-scale publisher, our power resides in mobility and flexible strength, like the sparrow as much as the eagle, which is strong in beak and can fly away in an instant, but holds its own, to a degree, when buffeted by winds of change. INTRODUCTON

A Noted Author and Former Editor of the *British Journal of Photography*.

Photography was never meant to be ephemeral: and it was the need to fix an image permanently on paper that provided photography's first technical challenge. Digital photography has changed that, but it's hoped good digital images will still be made lasting.

There has always been an optimum moment at which to capture a photo, whether it is when a model looks most engaging or as a high-jumper glides over the bar — photographs are idealized remnants, 'decisive moments'. But when images are seen on screens before drifting into the mists of time, perhaps never being printed, it remains crucial we continue to compile collections of pictures documenting real life.

The days of the discovered shoe-box — encapsulating a family's marriages, births, holidays, celebrations and achievements — are fast receding, robbing future social historians of a wealth of everyday materials. Glossy coffee-table books from big-name photographers/agencies do not include these types of images, because the lives they document seem unexceptional. It's likely *Picture Post* great Bert Hardy, who had to first work long and hard as a freelancer, and his peers would experience huge frustration finding publishers, if they were young photographers today. This book would have welcomed Hardy and mates with open arms, but how many other books like this are still being published?

You hold in your hands a piece of history; a record of contemporary life that follows in a long-established but now disappearing tradition. Treasure this book, for it is a vision of the present for people yet to come; people who we hope will regard our seemingly unexceptional todays as valuable yesterdays.






























