






UNIVERSITY LIBRARIES by the numbers 2017



3,454,500 searches in 322 databases



Links to U. S. government documents listing retail prices for typical consumer purchases, and wages for common occupations. All data is for the United States unless specifically indicated.

Prices and Wages by Decade

This guide points to U.S. government publications showing average retail prices for common items or "necessities of life." Prices for foods, medicine, articles of clothing, household items, physical goods and common services fall within the domain of this guide. We've added price data for major purchases -- a house, a car, a college education. We always prefer pointing to federal and state agency publications, but will substitute other primary sources if government data is unavailable.

Price data is most meaningful when viewed in historical context. So, side-by-side with price data, you will find links to average wages, salaries, hours and earnings for workers in the same decades. For viewing any dollar amount in a longer term context, we recommend the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics' Consumer Price Index (CPI) Inflation Calculator.

Federal Depository Library No. 0321

The Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP) was established by Congress to ensure that the American public has access to its Government's information. Since 1813, depository libraries have safeguarded the public's right to know by collecting, organizing, maintaining, preserving, and assisting users with information from the Federal Government. The FDLP provides U.S. Government information at no cost to designated depository libraries. These depository libraries, in turn, provide local, no-fee access to Government information in an impartial environment with professional assistance. MU Libraries have participated in the FDLP since 1862.

MU serves as Regional Federal Depository Library for the State of Missouri. Under Title 44 United States Code, Section 1912, Regional Depositories provide coordination to ensure that at least one tangible copy of each depository document remains in the state, and they provide interlibrary loan, reference service, and collection management assistance to other FDLP libraries in Missouri. We have Intrastate Regional agreements with several other libraries. The full agreements are below.
