Blackboard vs. ERes

- Blackboard allows you to provide your students online access to course materials, maintain grades, etc. Blackboard does not monitor copyright issues.
- ERes is an online reserve system to provide students with access to course materials. You can fax paper documents (articles, book chapters, class notes, old exams, homework solutions, etc.) to ERes to be converted to PDF and posted to your ERes course site. Library staff will monitor copyright issues, seek permission, and pay royalties if necessary.
- Blackboard and ERes can be used simultaneously when you have copyrighted material in ERes but also want to manage your course through Blackboard. It is easy to link to your ERes site so that your students have access to all of your course materials.
