## Characteristics:

- -Discussion led by faculty members, a different one each time.
- -Books chosen by faculty.
- -Books should be accessible can be fiction or nonfiction, but should be appealing to a broad educated public
- -Publicized on the library home page and with a press release to various press outlets; efforts may be made to gain visibility on the main university page.
- -Would bring further visibility to the Information Commons and the library as gathering place.
- -Would provide an opportunity for members of the campus community to interact in an intelligent but not work-related way this includes library folks (within MULSA's mission to do things for "the human side" of work at the MU Libraries) -Would try to focus on recruiting faculty who have recently been given teaching awards. Such faculty might be most receptive to the idea of doing something like this.
- -We might call ours the Tiger's Paw Book Club if so, we might even be able to sell mugs or bookmarks.
- -Department chairs would be notified

## Tasks:

- -Think of the best way to contact faculty (get names of recent winners of teaching awards, find librarians who know them and/or would be willing to SPEAK with them PERSONALLY about doing this).
- -Write up a little information packet or website describing the program, for use by faculty
- -Write up press releases and announcements
- -Write up boilerplate announcements to send to department heads
- -Try to get Jim's approval. Could possibility get the A&S dean to sign an announcement letter and take some credit also. They might even put up a small amount of \$\$ to pay for campuswide emails or other publicity. Or, Jim might.
- -Maintain a website like the one at UW
- -Make up a little sign and/or a flyer for the sandwich boards at the entrances to the library  $\ \ \,$
- -If the MULSA board approves this, I could write up a fuller version of this as a proposal to Mary (Head of Reference) and Jim (Director).
