- Budget update
 - The University is unable to continue providing the bailout funds.
 - They acknowledge that we are taking an extra cut due to journal inflation.
 - They expect the new budget model to aid us greatly.
 - They have been notified that these cuts have the potential to seriously affect our ARL and AAU status.
- Engineering Library
 - There is an article in the Missourian that reported on the Forum for the Engineering Students hosted by Dean Lobo. A comment from Ann is mentioned.  - Representatives are on a site visit with University Libraries today. They hope to gather information to provide a quote on moving Archives and digitizing microfilm.
- Space Consultants

 - Although we would like to save money by using students for a project like this, it is less feasible due to the timeline and potential lack of recognition at the administrative level.
- Sr. Human Resources Specialist position update
 - Thank you to everyone who participated in the HR search.
 - The HR Specialist Sr. search was unsuccessful.
 - We are now looking into doing a shared HR position with another unit on campus through Campus HR.
 - Nicole Whyte has been hired full time as the HR Assistant.
- Retirement
 - If you are considering retirement please let your supervisor know so that we can take this into account for next year's budget.

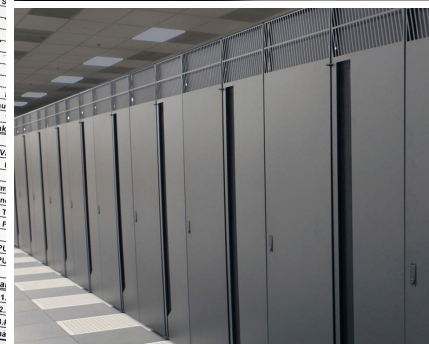
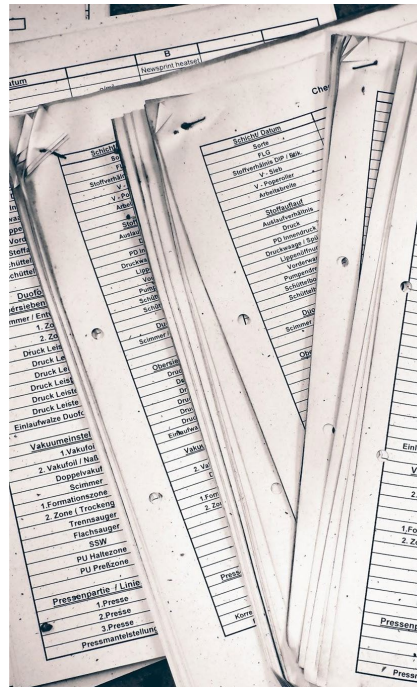

If you identified any categories of electronic government information above, do you think that there are any potential risks that might threaten the long-term survival of this information?

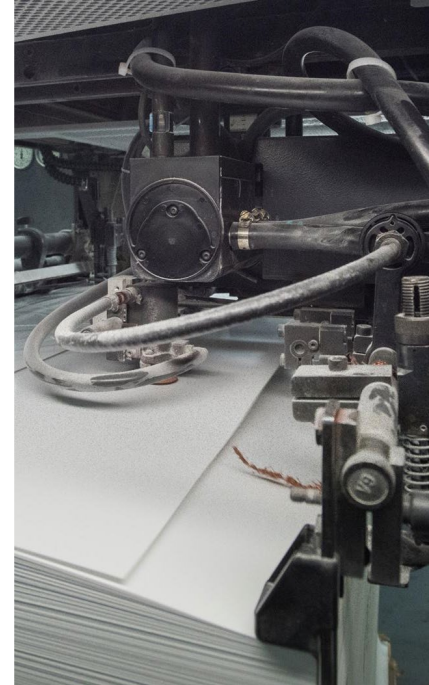


PEGI Three Questions : Question 3

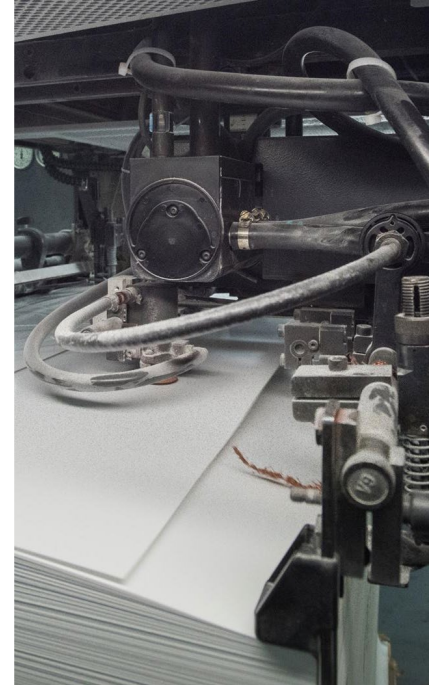

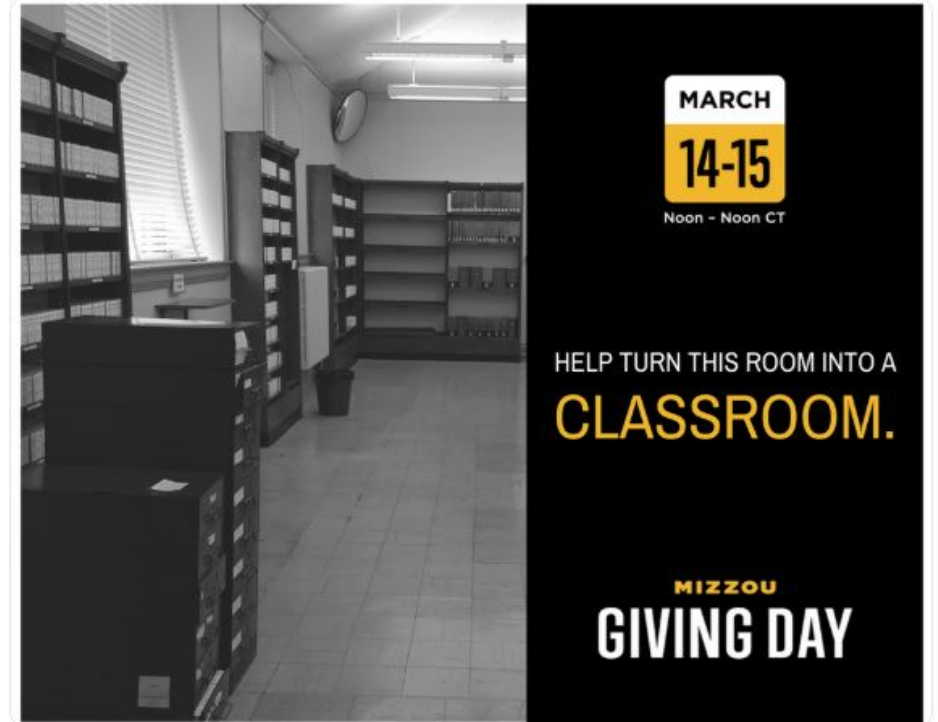

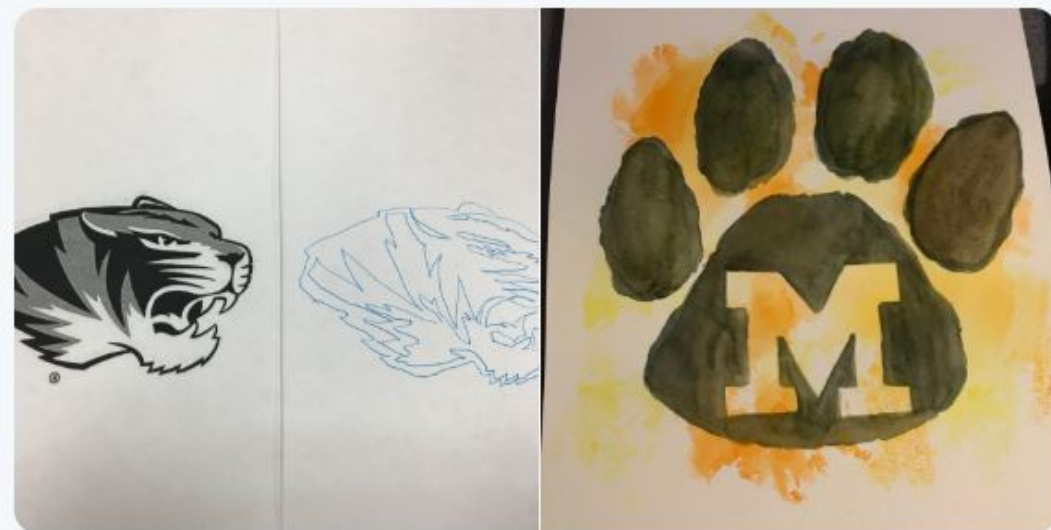
