



- Author's Preface -

In April 2000, my son and I visited my brother, Tom, and his wife, Joy, in Washington, D.C. We took many photos then, and published a book, 'Vital Washington'. Two early D.C. views, though not published in the present book, inspired us later – Matt's view of the Lincoln Memorial by day, and my view of 'Spirit of St. Louis'. Both views have been published in the 'Spirit of America' books I direct/edit.


The present book reveals new D.C. photos, and other recent photos, of mine; Matt was not travelling with me this time; he's in the Army now, serving our country well. I'm inspired by his 2006 photo: his night-view of the WWII Memorial (see cover). Life picture editor George Pitts said it's 'perfectly photographed'. Unlike the Lincoln Memorial, which I'd wanted to photograph by night from the spot Matt photographed it by day, I wasn't able to find the spot Matt took his WWII Memorial photo from – there were so many people around me then; I hope to do so, in future. One of my day-views of another part of that Memorial is published here.

The people who let me photograph them in April 2010, from Tom and Joy, to Smithsonian National Museum of American History Archivist David Haberstich, who deals with my Campaign 2008 works, etc., to top journalist/author ('Eyes on the Prize') Juan Williams, were very helpful. The capital is diverse — from Eastern Market to Memorials to Japan Festival, Government buildings, Smithsonian museums, US Holocaust Memorial Museum, Newseum, and National Public Radio, for starters.

There are many other sights I wish I could have seen in my nine-day, 2010 tour, like the National Museum of the American Indian, where some of my works are housed. Other sights, my son and I have photographed previously. I did photograph the National Portrait Gallery this time, where I hope some of my best photo-portraits are included, soon. I'd hoped to visit the Indian Museum my last full day in town this April, but it grew damp and chill, and I'd caught a bad cold.

But it was a Capital Tour. Since 1979, when I took up photography, most of the time, I see photographs. I hope my selected new photos from D.C., plus other recent photos in this book, suggest my new work well. Thank you all for assisting – Matt, our extended family, photo-subjects (including those not pictured here, due mainly to my technical poverty in photographing you), production team, reviewers (including my former teacher Roger Grant), archivists, sellers, and reader-viewers. And thank God, too.

Finally, every publication is an author's venture into the public arena, and public service is something a writer-photographer can do, as crucially as a soldier and/or other public employee can do it. Let's hope this book is significant-enough to make a positive addition to many people's lives, on behalf of peace and prosperity. Please enjoy this book, then, created for you, dear reader, and for all who read it, in the public arena.-djm.
























